HUNTER FARNHAM INQUIRY MEMORIAL KEYNOTE LECTURE

Robert S. Ross is Professor of Political Science at Boston College and Associate, John King Fairbank Center for Chinese Studies, Harvard University. He received his Ph.D. in Political Science from Columbia University in 1984. He has taught at Columbia University and at the University of Washington and in 1989 was a Guest Scholar at the Brookings Institution in Washington, D.C. In 1994-1995 he was Fulbright Professor at the Chinese Foreign Affairs College, in 2003 he was a Visiting Senior Fellow at the Institute of International Strategic Studies, Qinghua University, Beijing, and in 2014 was Visiting Scholar, School of International Relations, Peking University. In 2009 he was Visiting Scholar, Institute for Strategy, Royal Danish Defence College. From 2009-2014 he has been Adjunct Professor, Institute for Defence Studies, Norwegian Defence University College.



Professor Ross's research focuses on Chinese security policy and defense policy, East Asian security, and U.S.-China relations. His recent publications include *Chinese Security Policy: Structure, Power, and Politics*, *China's Ascent: Power, Security, and the Future of International Politics*, and *New Directions in the Study of Chinese Foreign Policy*. His other major works include *Normalization of U.S.-China Relations: An International History*; *Great Wall and Empty Fortress: China's Search for Security*, *Negotiating Cooperation: U.S.-China Relations, 1969-1989*, and *The Indochina Tangle: China's Vietnam Policy, 1975-1979*. Professor Ross is the author of numerous articles in *World Politics*, *The China Quarterly*, *International Security*, *Security Studies*, *Orbis*, *Foreign Affairs*, *Foreign Policy*, *The National Interest*, and *Asian Survey*. His books and articles have been translated in China, Taiwan, South Korea, Japan, and various European countries.

Professor Ross has testified before various Senate and House committees and the Defense Policy Board Advisory Committee, he advises U.S. government agencies, and he serves on the Academic Advisory Group, U.S.-China Working Group, United States Congress. He is a member of the Council on Foreign Relations and the National Committee for U.S.-China Relations. Professor Ross is Senior Advisor to the Institute for American Studies, Shanghai. He is a founding member and former board member of the United States Committee of the Council for Security Cooperation in the Asia-Pacific (USCSCAP).

HUNTER FARNHAM

Hunter Farnham began working on the problems of economic, environmental, and social development in Africa in the 1960s, primarily for the U.S. Agency for International Development, eventually traveling to more than 35 countries on the continent. Among his positions were Uganda desk officer, Assistant Director for the Sahel and Francophone West Africa, Officer-in-Charge of Zimbabwe and Ethiopia and Djibouti programs, heading the USAID Missions in Uganda and Guinea-Bissau and various special assistantships and directorships of inter-Agency taskforces on African emergencies such as locust plagues, famines, droughts, and problems of refugees and displaced persons. He also consulted extensively for a number of American NGOs. Hunter was a member of the Institute for Global Leadership's External Advisory Board and advised the Current Events & International Relations Club at Phillips Exeter Academy, which participated in the EPIIC Inquiry program for many years. Among his other activities included: seaman in the Canadian merchant marine, a former editor/writer/photographer for international Grand Prix/Sports Car racing, captain of the US State Department tennis team, and life member of the Sudan Studies Association.
