## HUNTER FARNHAM

Hunter Farnham began working on the problems of economic, environmental, and social development in Africa in the 1960s, primarily for the U.S. Agency for International Development, eventually traveling to more than 35 countries on the continent. Among his positions were Uganda desk officer, Assistant Director for the Sahel and Francophone West Africa, Officer-in-Charge of Zimbabwe and Ethiopia and Djibouti programs, heading the USAID Missions in Uganda and Guinea-Bissau and various special assistantships and directorships of inter-Agency taskforces on African emergencies such as locust plagues, famines, droughts, and problems of refugees and displaced persons. He also consulted extensively for a number of American NGOs.



Hunter was a member of the Institute for Global Leadership's External Advisory Board and advised the Current Events & International Relations Club at Phillips Exeter Academy, which had participated in the EPIIC Inquiry program for many years.

Among his other activities included: seaman in the Canadian merchant marine, a former editor/writer/photographer for international Grand Prix/ Sports Car racing, captain of the US State Department tennis team, and life member of the Sudan Studies Association.

**Rachel Brown (EPIIC'08, A'10)**

Rachel Brown is the Executive Director of Over Zero. Over Zero supports societies to resist division and create long-term resilience to identity-based conflict through trainings, strategy advising, piloting and testing new approaches, and supporting interdisciplinary research. She is the author of *Defusing Hate: A Strategic Communication Guide to Counteract Dangerous Speech*, which brings together insights from diverse fields of expertise - from marketing to cognitive neuroscience - to support practitioners seeking to design communications-based interventions for atrocity prevention. She was a 2014 Genocide Prevention Fellow at the United States Holocaust Memorial Museum Simon-Skjoldt Center for the Prevention of Genocide. Rachel also founded and is the former CEO of Sisi ni Amani-Kenya (SNA-K), a Kenyan NGO that pioneered new strategies to build local capacity for peacebuilding and civic engagement.

**"Migration in a Turbulent World"**

**Professor Abi Williams**

Dr. Williams is the Director of the Institute for Global Leadership and a Professor of the Practice of International Politics at The Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy at Tufts University. He is the former first President of The Hague Institute for Global Justice, where he spearheaded its development into a vibrant think and do tank working on issues at the critical intersection of peace, security, and justice. Prior to leading The Hague Institute, Dr. Williams served at the United States Institute of Peace as Senior Vice President of the Center for Conflict Management from 2010 to 2012, leading its work in major conflict zones such as Afghanistan, Pakistan, Iraq, and Libya, and as Vice President of the Center for Conflict Analysis and Prevention from 2008 to 2009. From 2001 to 2007, Dr. Williams was Director of Strategic Planning for United Nations Secretaries-General Ban Ki-Moon and Kofi Annan in New York. He gained valuable field operational experience, serving with the United Nations from 1994 to 2000 in peacekeeping operations in the Balkans and Haiti, in senior political and humanitarian roles. As a scholar-practitioner, Dr. Williams has held academic appointments including as Centennial Fellow and Adjunct Professor of International Relations at the Edmund A. Walsh School of Foreign Service at Georgetown University, and Associate Dean for Academic Affairs, Africa Center for Strategic Studies at the National Defense University.
